CAREERS.

Ever thought that a hospital was only doctors and nurses?

Read on:

Dietitians are concerned with food and nutrition. Mostly they are employed in hospitals where they plan suitable meals for patients needing special diets. The completion of an appropriate university degree course eg. Science, Physiology etc. is required. Following this, there is 1 year's training at a suitable hospital. The Medical Records Librarian is in charge of the medical and clinical records of a hospital. She assists physicians in using them for purposes of diagnosis and research. The H.S.C. is necessary. The Occupational Therapist is concerned with the treatment of physical or mental illness by carefully selected activities eg handicrafts. She also helps incapacitated people to adapt to new equipment which will aid them eg special wheel-chairs. Matriculation and a 3-year training course are required. The

Orthoptist assists in the diagnosis and treatment of eye muscles defects of the eye in the form of eye exercises. Applicants need to have the H.S.C. There are 2 branches of Radiography - the diagnostic radiographer who takes X-ray films for the diagnosis and subsequent treatment of medical conditions. The therapeutic radiographer is concerned with the treatment of diseases by radiation. The entry requirement is a pass in the H.S.C. including Science (Physics), Maths and English.

This is only a very brief outline of some hospital occupations. Others are Hospital Administration, Medicine, Nursing, Pathology, and speech therapy. See Mrs. Breakwell for more information and other hospital careers.

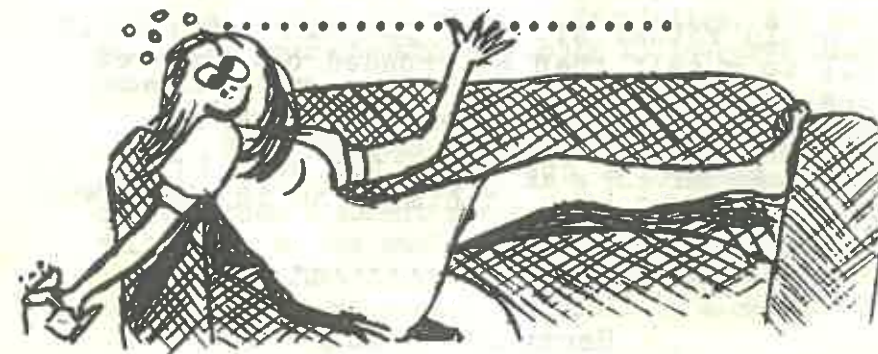

## BEAUTY BAZAAR

Every girl at some time feels jealous of model's  
complexions, of their grooming, style and general  
poised appearance. What's their secret? Main thing is  
to play up your best features and work at inspiring  
the not-so-good points. Soon you'll get into a regular  
beauty routine. Only with every day care can you keep  
up that look - but it's more than worth it!

A glowing clear skin is every girl's aim - but you  
can't have it just by wishing.

The popular tale that soap and water harms your  
skin is not always true. In fact it is good for an oily  
skin after you have used a cleanser. Normal and dry  
skins should avoid soap. If you have either of these  
types of skin then a cosmetic cleanser is the best  
answer of all.

The next step is to examine your skin and decide  
what colour it is, and then what shape your face is.  
If your skin is pink then you should subdue the rosy  
glow with a beige foundation. If you have a sallow skin  
go for a foundation with a rosy tinge to counteract the  
yellowness. Remember, makeup is not there to conceal  
or decorate, so when buying a foundation choose a light,  
translucent one. You don't want anything that will look  
like caked-on paint. Makeup is there simply to emphasise  
subtly what you already have. If you accentuate at all,  
the aim should be to accentuate only what is natural.  
Rouge is just as important as foundation, and so to  
emphasise your cheekbones, apply it in a curve under the  
bone structure.

Just one final thing before you start to apply your  
makeup. Have you ever looked at your eyebrows? Do they  
sprout? Do they straggle like a Russian vine? So please  
do give them a decent shape. It can make an enormous  
difference to the whole appearance of your eyes. Don't  
be drastic. Just follow the natural line of the brow,  
thinning from underneath and plucking along the direc-  
tion of the hairs growth.

"learning orientated" "very co-operative girls"

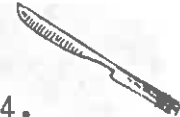
"As the school is so disciplined, it interferes with intellectual freedom, but this does make it easier to teach"

Now we come to the big step - the EYES-. False eyelashes should really be put on before using eyeliner, but without a good deal of practice it's not always easy to get them so close to the lash line that you avoid a pink gap.

The eyelashes to use are the long spiky ones with the matching lower lashes. (There is a fantastic set on the market at the moment with five different pairs of upper lashes and five different pairs of lower lashes. So if you're like me and put on a pair of lashes as soon as you get out of your school uniform this is the ideal wardrobe and for \$11.35 it works out at just over \$1 a pair.) After applying your eyelashes the next step is eyeshadow. Apply the pearly white cream just below your brow for about one-third of an inch, then a pale colour - purple being beautiful - and then just above the crease on the eyelid lightly brush on, with one long fine stroke, your double line, using a dry eyeliner brush and brown powder eyeshadow and then once you have your line, with a slightly wider brush go over this fine line with the same shadow and just widen this line, making sure that it is not too dark and doesn't look like boot-polish.

Lipstick is a beauty preparation that many girls feel it's fashionable to neglect. However if you are going to make up the rest of your face with plenty of colour for a natural effect you simply cannot leave your mouth as a chilly gap in the centre of your face. Well known model Jean Shrimpton uses only a lipgloss and pencil outline on her lips. This is alright for the camera, but for ordinary wear you need something.

Now that pale colours don't look as though they're made of candle wax there should be no problem.

This is just a guide, so if you try it and it doesn't suit you, for heavens sake don't wear it → don't just slavishly follow the fashion, adapt to suit yourself.

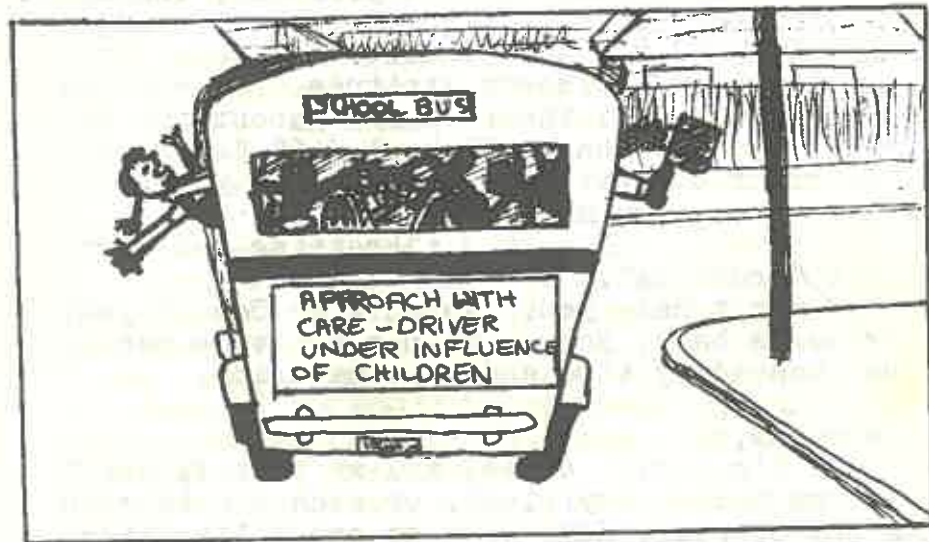

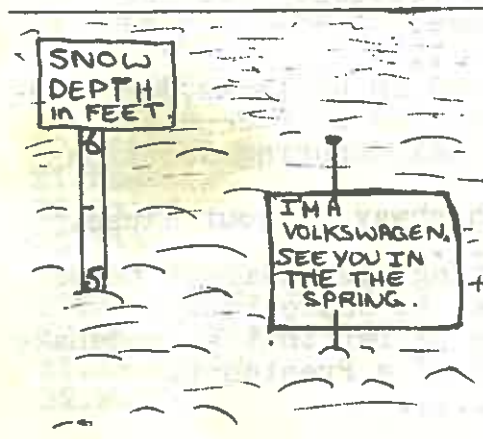

The tower green of London Tower where 3 queens were executed in the 16th century, is now covered with paving stones because no grass ever grew there again.

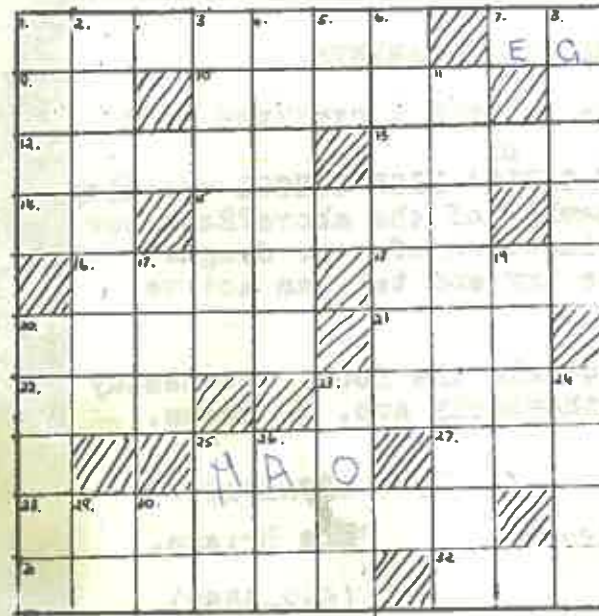
King Henry II of England in a campaign to wipe out robber barons, destroyed 1,115 castles.
